BISHOP RICHARD'S VISIT: On Friday evening Bishop Richard came to celebrate Mass with us at St. Wilfrid's: we were honoured that this was the last appointment in his diary at the end of his first year as Bishop of the diocese! He was here to give thanks with us for the first 100 years of our parish, to open our Centenary celebrations and to confirm Fr. John as parish priest. He invited Fr. John and the congregation to make an Act of Dedication to "continue the work of Prayer, Formation and Mission on the Centenary of the foundation of the parish."

Our thanks to all who helped make this a moving and uplifting evening: those who helped with the celebration of the Mass, organised the reception afterwards in the Hall and who contributed to the exhibition recording some of the story of our parish in its first 100 years.

MINISTERS OF HOLY COMMUNION: Corpus Christi, which we are celebrating today, is an occasion each year when those who are Commissioned to assist with the distribution of Holy Communion at Mass, and to take Communion to those who because of illness or the frailty of age are in hospital or confined to their home, are re-Commissioned for another year of service. Those Ministers who are not on holiday will renew their commitment at

their usual Mass this weekend. May we take this opportunity to thank them for the service they give to the parish and pray that they will continue to be faithful in their ministry?

The Fair is from 10.00am to 12.00noon in the Parish Hall. All will be most welcome.

MISSIONARY ENDEAVOUR OF THE DIOCESE: The annual retiring collection, that enables the diocese fulfil its overseas' missionary responsibilities, will be taken next weekend. It funds the support we can give to our twinned diocese of Chulucanas in Peru and supports those from our diocese on loan to, and working in, Chulucannas and other missionary dioceses.

COFFEE AFTER MASS: There will be the usual refreshments in the Hall after Mass next weekend: all will be most welcome, especially any visitors to the parish.

BAGS2THEFUTURE: Thanks to everyone who contributed clothes and shoes for the recent collection. The amount raised on this occasion was £124.80p for the Building Maintenance Fund. There will be another collection in the autumn.

CONGRATULATIONS SPH! Our deanery senior school - St. Philip Howard Catholic High School, in Barnham - has recently had a full Ofsted Inspection: it was recognised as "Outstanding" in all categories. The school has sent a note to "thank all parishioners, parents, carers and governors for their unfailing commitment and support over the years." In turn, may we add our congratulations to the Head, the teaching and support staff, and all the students on their wonderful achievement: there must be many others in the local community who have already sent a note of congratulations?

HOLY YEAR PILGRIMAGE: The parishes of the Cathedral Deanery will be making a Holy Year Pilgrimage to the Cathedral at Arundel on Saturday, 18th June. There will be a procession to and through the Jubilee of Mercy Holy Door, followed by an opportunity for prayer, reflection and, for those who wish, an opportunity to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation.
